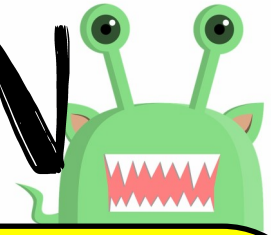


ADVERBIALS REVISION



Adverbials tell us more about a **VERB**.

Adverbials can be

a word

angrily

a phrase

between the chairs

or a clause.

after the rain ended

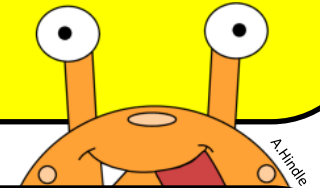
Adverbials tell us more about a **VERB**.

The monster *prowls* with hungry eyes.

The monster *prowls* beneath the bed.

The monster *prowls* during the night.

In each sentence, the verb is modified by the **adverbial**.



Adverbials often open with a **PREPOSITION**.

The monster *prowls* with hungry eyes.

The monster *prowls* beneath the bed.

The monster *prowls* during the night.

The **preposition** is part of the adverbial and links information to the sentence.

You can change the position of adverbials. The tiger prowled with hungry eyes.

The cat hunted through the grass.

Through the grass, the cat hunted.

When an adverbial appears in front of a sentence it is modifying, it is called a **fronted adverbial**.

In the moonlight garden, the fox searched.

Fronted adverbials are separated from the main clause by a **comma**.
