Formal writing doesn't use apostrophes for shortened versions of words, so you need to say 'He is', not 'He's'.

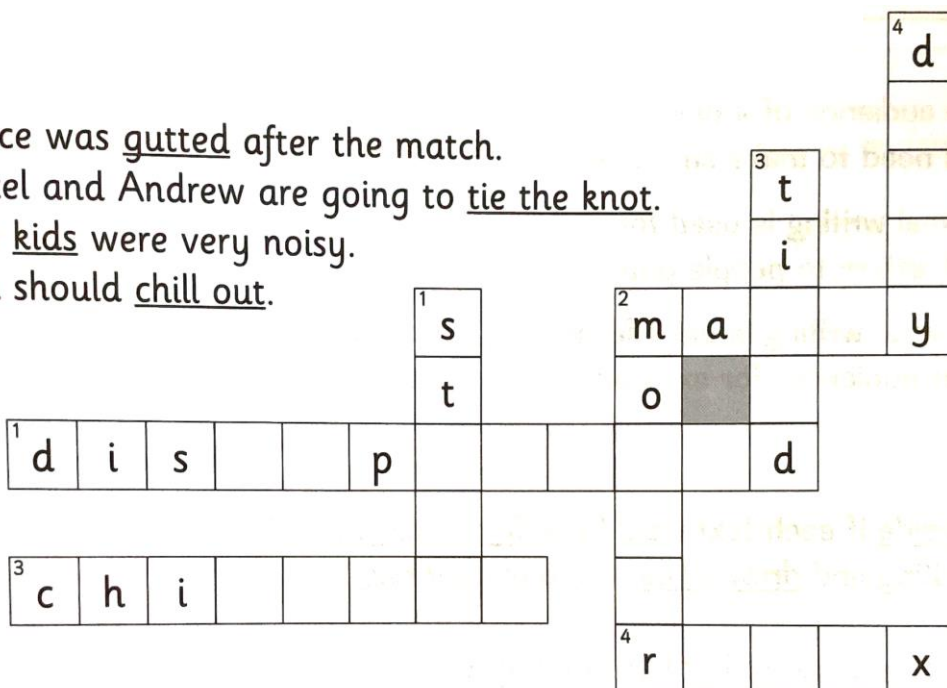
Informal vocabulary is **chattier** and **friendlier**.
