Meet with Anna Phillips to discuss reading ideas	Ideas presented from the Mission Masters to Anna: 1) Will the book nook be up and running again? If not, could we have a reading den instead. 2) Children want longer periods to read their books of choice for enjoyment. 3) Children would like older children to offer younger children expert tuition, can this be done as part of reading lessons/1:1 reading, etc. 4) KS2 felt that there is a want for longer free reading books, similar to books they may read at home. Mrs Phillips is going to organise a meeting to chat with some children from KS2. 5) KS1 children asked if the enquiry could be linked further to reading. 6) Children miss bug club, the fun element with quizzes. <i>Mission Masters are going to research other options.</i> 7) Discussed having parents/Grandparents to come share a book with children. Not linked to reading: 1) Children would like more school trips/visitors. <i>Mission Masters are going to talk to classmates to think of ways to link visits/trips to enquiries and learning.</i> 2) KS2 have asked if they can have a whole class reward system like KS1.

Dear Mission Masters,

Please accept my apologies for not being able to attend today's meeting. I have been called to an urgent meeting off site.

I would however like to respond to some of your requests that Mrs Williams passed on to me following the previous Mission Masters meeting.

Can KS2 children have fruit for morning break provided by school? Unfortunately this is out of schools control. The fruit KS1 children receive is from the local authority and is only provided free to KS1 children. Children in KS2 are welcome to bring in a healthy snack from home to enjoy at break time.

Can the kitchen provide ketchup, mayo and BBQ sauce? I have spoken with the kitchen and ketchup will be back on fish finger Friday as soon as the delivery is received.

Can the kitchen provide milkshake on a Friday for children as this would be exciting ? We discussed the cost implication of this and the team put forward maybe it could be a reward for children e/g. good behaviour, maybe children could be given raffle tickets for good behaviour and the class with the most raffle tickets at the end of the week have milkshake with lunch ? I have discussed options with the kitchen and we have agreed rather than a milkshake the kitchen could offer a fruit punch drink. This considers the children who have allergies/dietary needs. Mission Masters – do you think this should be available to everyone on a Friday or as a reward for the best behaved class that week as decided by the lunch team or do you have another suggestion?

Cup cakes for every child on their birthday! We discussed that as we have 420 children in school this would be difficult to manage and possibly wouldn't be fair for the children who have a birthday in the school holidays. – I agree this would be difficult to manage and upsetting if a child was missed. Children who have a birthday on a weekend or school holiday would also miss this.

I hope the above answers your questions. Please let me know what your thoughts are.

I do have a question for you all to investigate. I am looking at what clubs children may be interested in having after school? I am looking into hiring our school hall on an evening to make additional money for our school and wondered what type of clubs you may be interested in. I have had one lady make contact who runs a drama club. Is this something children would be interested in or do you have others ideas for me to look at?
