Colons and Semi-Colons

Remember, **colons** introduce lists and explanations, and **semi-colons** break up lists and clauses in a sentence. Punctuation can **change the meaning**:

I sleep all day; I work all night

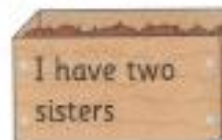
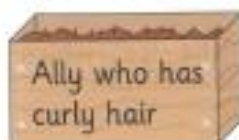
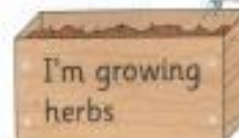
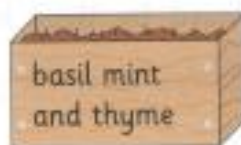
A **semi-colon** means that these two parts are **related** and **equally important**, but they're **separate**.

I sleep all day: I work all night

With a **colon**, the second part **explains** the first part, so this means I sleep all day **because** I work all night.
